

## Planner's Commentary: Standard Course

If you don't understand how to solve any of these problems, just ask me or any of the elites hanging around chatting.

1	B	There is a gap between the two sections of wall. It needs to be on the end of one of them.
2	Z	Use the stream to work out which ride you're looking at. The one just in front of you is the correct one, but there aren't any kites in it.
3	A	All of the kites are on the stream. Walk west to look up the ride to see which kite is in the centre of it.
4	B	The kite needs to be on the end of the earth wall. The A kite is in the ditch.
5	C	It needs to be just this side of the earth bank and in line with the centre of the clearing behind you.
6	Z	The circle on the map is almost on the path, so both kites are far too far away.
7	C	The kite is at the foot of the hill on the vegetation boundary, so the kite should be touching the trees.
8	B	Identify the trees you are looking at, then double check the kite is on the correct side of the tree, which indeed it is.
9	A	Up the stream on the left, about 14 metres away.
10	A	First identify the two mapped knolls. It's on the left one.
11	C	Which side of the hill does the kite need to be on? It needs to be in the rough open, but the D kite (west foot of the hill) is on the vegetation boundary.
12	A	Which ditch does the kite need to be on? It's almost at the end of the ditch.

Timed controls – we don't often set these on the standard course, but will always have them on the elite for when you're ready to move up. They're designed to put you under pressure as a tie-breaker. There are no zeroes, so just pick the kite that's the closest fit.

TC1.1	B	Fence end.
TC1.2	D	On the opposite bank of the pond, in line between you and the chimney.
TC2.1	F	The kite is 6m behind the vegetation boundary.
TC2.2	B	Which part of the hill?

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
